

From the Pastor's Desk:

Dear Parishioners,
I thank you for your continued prayers and faithfulness to our Lord Jesus Christ. All things of this earth are passing, but the Lord and our relationship to Him is eternally significant. As we conclude our devotions to Our Lady of Guadalupe, and send the official Missionary Image on to its next destination, I give some news and entrust all our plans to Jesus Christ through the Immaculate Heart of His Mother. Firstly, I received the name of a priest who is scheduled to be my assistant. Let us pray for Fr. Paul. He is an Asian priest belonging to a Diocese in India, and he is in process of coming to Vermont, under an arrangement between his bishop and ours. The parishes of Barton and Troy should be his first assignment of priestly ministry in Vermont, first of perhaps a few. Secondly, I share with you (thank you for your prayers) that I am in consideration to be dean of the Northeast Kingdom Deanery of Catholic parishes. The dean of any area of a Diocese is appointed by the Bishop, and our current dean of the Northeast Kingdom area, Fr. Bernie Gaudreau, is retiring from administrative responsibilities. The position of dean only brings a small number of responsibilities compared to a parish pastor. Nonetheless, I will be happy to have Fr. Paul as my assistant if I also get the responsibilities of dean added. Please know that I want to focus heavily on the writing of homilies, spiritual lessons, teachings, and instructions with Fr. Paul or with any other priest from other countries who can share in the ministerial work of the parish. I may ask parishioners to help record homilies and messages for transcription. The ministry of a priest has three parts: to lead in charity, to sanctify sacramentally, and to teach apostolically. Let us take advantage of every modern technological convenience to receive the teaching ministry of our missionary priests who may continue to come from other countries. God bless you all and thank you for your prayers.

She is the Patroness of the Americas, Patroness of the Unborn and Patroness of the New Evangelization, come venerate this miraculous image with special devotions, petitions and prayers.
