Some Comparative Statistics for the Diocese of Burlington

1990

97 Parishes and 44 Missions (140 buildings), being served by 85 diocesan priests and 10 religious order priests as pastors. Parochial Vicars added to the total number of priests in parishes.

112 active diocesan priests serving in the Diocese, including 10 in Chancery work, VCC, religious education, liturgy, tribunal, special ministry and advanced studies.

Diocesan Councils and Committees:

Diocesan Administrative Board: The civil/legal board that directs the work of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Burlington, VT, Inc. The Board is comprised of the Bishop, Vicar General and then up to six other members. Reviews budgets, parish reports, etc.

Board of Incorporators, Vermont Catholic Charities: The civil/legal board that directs the work of the VCC, Inc. At present the same membership of RCDB.

Diocesan Finance Council: Per canons 492-494 of the *Code of Canon Law*. The canonical board which assists the Diocesan Bishop in caring for the temporal goods of the Diocese, parishes and associated entities. Meets with the DABNCC.

Diocesan Investment Committee: The board which oversees the investment portfolio of the RCDB and VCC. Also provides investment oversight to the Vermont Catholic Community Foundation.

Diocesan Building Commission: Charged with reviewing parish building projects which exceed \$10,000_00 in expense. Offers recommendations for approval to the Diocesan Bishop as the Trustee of the Parish Charitable Trusts. Also reviews the Safety First Program projects presented by the Diocesan Office of Facilities and Insurance.

Vermont Catholic Community Foundation: Recently established foundation charged with providing opportunities for the establishment of endowments for parishes, schools, etc. Recently featured in the Vermont Catholic Magazine.

There may be other boards established for the Worship, Catechesis/Evangelization, Youth Ministry.
